

ABOUT US

Fire District 3 provides fire suppression, emergency medical and rescue services, and community risk reduction to more than 54,000 residents living in the communities of Central Point, White City, Eagle Point, Gold Hill, Sams Valley, Dodge Bridge, and Agate Lake. The District's 72 employees and 18 volunteers work from four career stations, four volunteer stations, and an Administration office to provide coverage to the 167 square miles that encompass the District.




GOVERNANCE AND BUDGET:

Jackson County Fire District 3 is organized as a Special District under ORS Chapter 478. It was originally formed as the Central Point Rural Fire Protection District on July 28, 1952. The District is governed by an elected five-member Board of Directors that meet on the third Thursday of every month at the Administration Building in White City at 5:15pm. The public is welcome to attend meetings.

The District has a permanent tax rate of \$3.1194 per \$1,000 of assessed value. Budgeted property tax revenue for the 2021/22 fiscal year is \$15,525,000. The District has a budget policy of maintaining a minimum of 6% of property tax revenue for contingency and 26% in ending fund balance. This provides the cash necessary to cover expenses at the beginning of the fiscal year until the first tax payments are collected and distributed by the County. The total general fund budget for fiscal year 2021/22 is \$22,280,200


The total budget for all funds for fiscal year 2021/22 is \$25,877,300.

General Fund Revenue Fiscal Year 2021/2022


